




WORLDS OF FUN ADDS FLIGHT RIDE FOR 1996

Kansas City, Mo. - High flying fun awaits guests at Worlds of Fun in 1996 with the RipCord, a Skycoaster ride that combines the thrills of sky-diving, hanggliding and bungee jumping into one adrenaline pumping adventure.

The RipCord will tower high above Beat Street Lake in the Americana section of Worlds of Fun. Fliers will be outfitted in flight suits connected to a stainless steel aircraft cable. Positioned parallel to the ground on a launch pad, fliers will be hoisted to the top of a steel tower approximately 180 feet above take-off where they will pull an actual rip cord to initiate flight. Fliers then plummet toward the earth and eventually soar past their starting point reaching speeds up to 80 miles per hour. In a pendulum-like arch motion, fliers will experience a feeling of weightlessness as they complete the swing opposite the take-off tower before several more continuous swings. Fliers are then slowed to a stop and returned to the launch site where they are safely released from the harness.

Flights on the RipCord are separate from the park admission. Flights are \$14.95 per flier for three people; \$19.95 per person with two fliers and \$24.95 for solo flights. Reservations will be required to ride the RipCord, and fliers must be at least 42 inches tall.


Manufactured by Sky Fun 1 of Longmont, Colo., the Skycoaster is one of the most popular and fastest selling thrill rides to ever be introduced. Since the ride's introduction in 1992, its popularity has spread worldwide. The Skycoaster has been well received by thrill seekers everywhere with 31 Skycoaster rides currently operating internationally and 15 more scheduled to open in 1996.

In addition to the RipCord, the Detonator will challenge the laws of gravity at Worlds of Fun this spring with its 200-foot, twin tower structure. Twelve passengers will surround each tower and shoot toward the sky at a force of 4.5 G's reaching 45 miles per hour in one second. Riders then descend to earth faster than a free-fall at one negative G before several up and down motions bring the ride to a stop.

Worlds of Fun is a 170-acre entertainment complex filled with major rides, entertaining shows and thrilling attractions. The park is located on the east loop of I-435 at exit 54 in Kansas City and is open weekends in the spring and fall and daily throughout the summer. Worlds of Fun is the number one tourist attraction in Kansas City.

Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun will distribute press releases highlighting any special events or attractions throughout the season. There may be additional story opportunities with which the World of Fun Public Relations office will be happy to assist you. Following is a list of some potential areas of interest.

BUSINESS...Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun are owned and operated by Cedar Fair, L.P., a publicly traded limited partner-ship (NYSE: FUN). Cedar Fair, L.P. also owns and operates Cedar Point located on the shores of Lake Erie between Cleveland, Ohio and Detroit, Michigan; Valleyfair near Minneapolis-St. Paul, Minnesota and Dorney Park and Wildwater Kingdom near Allentown, Pennsylvania.

LANDSCAPING...Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun employ a full-time landscaping staff year round. On site greenhouses hold hundreds of hanging basket plants, tropicals, bedding arrangements and close to 5,000 cannas to theme all areas of the parks.

EXPANSION...Since its opening in 1973, Worlds of Fun has continued to expand and add new attractions each year. The biggest expansion this decade will take riders to new heights of fun in 1996. The Detonator is the World's first 200-foot, twintower, 24-passenger ride that defies gravity as it reaches vertical speeds of 45 miles per hour. The all new RipCord combines skydiving and a free-fall flight for an adrenaline pumping adventure. (An additional fee will be required to ride RipCord). Plus, the Berenstain Bears make their home at Worlds of Fun beginning Memorial Day Weekend.

LIVE ENTERTAINMENT...National recording acts will visit the Forum Amphitheatre this summer as part of Worlds of Fun's summer concert series. Worlds of Fun also provides its own version of entertainment with its "Stax of Wax" show, and "Country Revue" each performed daily during the summer. Performers from all over the Midwest are a part of these live shows.

STUDENT EVENTS...Each year, thousands of students visit Worlds of Fun with their classmates for a fun and educational experience. Events include Theatre Alive Day, Physics Day, Environmental Day, International Language Day, plus two School Days. Students compete in Festival of Bands, Festival of Choirs, and Dance Festivals. See 1996 Operating Calendar for dates.

EMPLOYMENT...Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun provide thousands of summer jobs to people ranging in age from 15 to 81. Many employees are students, while others include retired people or teachers working during summer break.

HISTORY...With its 25th season approaching next year, Worlds of Fun has an extensive history of facts and fun plus a future filled with exciting things to come.

CHARITABLE CAUSES... Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun give back to the community whenever possible. In addition to public appearances by its characters at special events, Worlds of Fun hosts the MDA Telethon each fall and has raised money for several organizations including: The Children's Place, Blue Cros/Blue Shield of Kansas City's Caring Program for Children, Ronald McDonald Children's Charities, Swope Parkway Mental Health Center and numerous other not-for-profit agencies.

FUN HISTORY

Well into its third decade, Worlds of Fun has an extensive history of fun. Today, Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun make up the number one tourist attraction in the Kansas City area. The parks cover over 230 acres with rides, shows and attractions.

- 1971 Construction begins on Worlds of Fun.
- 1973 Worlds of Fun opens with rides, shows and attractions on May 26.
- 1974 The Forum Amphitheatre is opened. Worlds of Fun celebrates its one millionth visitor.
- 1976 Bicentennial Square and a double-loop roller coaster are added to commemorate the nation's 200th birthday.
- 1980 The Orient Express steel roller coaster debuts taking riders down a115-foot drop at 65 miles per hour and through two interlocking loops.
- 1982 Worlds of Fun celebrates its tenth anniversary. Oceans of Fun opens as the Midwest's largest water attraction.
- 1984 The Fury of the Nile river rapids ride debuts as Worlds of Fun's largest expansion project to date.
- 1986 Worlds of Fun adds the Omegatron, a six-story, upside-down thrill ride. Worlds of Fun gives its 200 millionth ride.
- 1987 The 15th anniversary of Worlds of Fun brings Pandamonium, a special area just for kids. Oceans of Fun adds the Carribean Cooler, an 810-foot lazy river float trip.
- 1988 Worlds of Fun introduces the Plunge, four lightning quick hydroflumes and passes the 20 millionth visitor mark.

 Oceans of Fun entertains its 2 millionth visitor.
- 1989 The Timber Wolf, 4,320 feet of spine-tingling terror, is unleashed at Worlds of Fun featuring a 95-foot drop and an upward spiraling 120-foot helix.
- 1991 The Timber Wolf is ranked number one in the world by coaster enthusiasts.
- 1992 Worlds of Fun turns 20 and brings the torrential power of the Monsoon water ride. Oceans of Fun introduces Coconut Cove, a super pool for kids and adults.
- 1995 Cedar Fair, L.P. purchases Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun from Hunt Midwest Enterprises. Cedar Fair also owns and operates Cedar Point, Sandusky, Ohio; Dorney Park/Wildwater Kingdom, Allentown, Pennsylvania; and Valleyfair, Shakopee, MN.
- 1996 Worlds of Fun reaches new heights of fun with the Detonator, the first two-tower, 24-passenger structure in the world towering 200 feet tall; and the new RipCord combines the thrills of skydiving and bungee jumping into an adrenaline pumping adventure. Memorial Day weekend brings the lovable Berenstain Bears to their new home at Worlds of Fun!

Worlds of Fun Reaches New Heights of Fun in 1996

With convenient park hours, special price offers and exciting entertainment, Worlds of Fun will kick off its 24th season on Saturday, April 13. Under the new management of Cedar Fair, L.P., Worlds of Fun will reach new heights of fun during 1996.

Worlds of Fun's newest ride, the Detonator, is a 'must ride' for thrill seekers. It's the first 200 foot, 24-passenger structure in the world, featuring two sky scraping towers. Twelve riders surround each tower as they are thrust 4.5 G's straight up while reaching speeds of 45 miles per hour in one second. Riders then descend faster than a free fall, defying gravity at a force of one negative G.

Beginning Memorial Day Weekend, the Berenstain Bear family will make their home at Worlds of Fun. Mama, Papa, Brother and Sister Bear will bring kids' favorite storybook characters to life.

Another new thrill for park guests is the RipCord. The experiences of skydiving and bungee jumping are combined in this adrenaline pumping adventure ride. Flyers are hoisted from land to a launch site over 180 feet above take off, where they pull a rip cord sending them swooping down to earth at speeds of up to 60 miles per hour. Fliers swing in a pendulum type motion several times before returning to the take off position. (An additional fee is required for RipCord).

Special new price offers make Worlds of Fun a great entertainment value. A twilight price, after 4:00 pm, will allow guests admission to Worlds of Fun for \$11.95. Kids, over three years old and up to 48 inches tall, will be admitted for only \$4.95 anytime. Children three and under are free and senior citizens \$11.95 (prices do not include tax).

Season Passports to Worlds of Fun or Oceans of Fun are a great value at \$56.95. A Bonus Season Passport to the other park can be added for \$24.95 and Family Season Passports, when purchasing a minimum of three, are available at a special price of \$49.95. Season Passports can be purchased at the Jones Store or at Worlds of Fun (prices do not include tax).

The Forum Amphitheatre at Worlds of Fun will be the site for some exciting entertainment this season. The country concert series will showcase Chely Wright, Bryan White, Steve Wariner, Martina McBride, Tracy Lawrence, Trisha Yearwood, Aaron Tippin and Diamond Rio with Wade Hayes. 

TASTE TREATS

Tempting taste treats can be found throughout Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun at over 20 restaurants and refreshment stands. Cuisine covers all the continents and includes turkey legs, chinese entrees, burgers, chicken, sub sandwiches, salads, corn dogs, pretzels, pizza and for the sweet tooth; funnel cakes, cookies, ice cream and cotton candy. At Worlds of Fun, the Inn of the Four Winds, in Scandinavia, is a sit-down facility with an "all you can eat" buffet and also serves sandwiches, desserts and assorted drinks. The Blue Bronco Tex Mex Cantina offers tasty tacos, beef and chicken fajitas, spicy enchiladas and tortilla chips in a cafeteria-style setting.

FUN FACTS

Worlds of Fun opened on May 26, 1973 based on Jules Verne's adventurous tale Around the World in Eighty Days. A wide variety of fun is featured in five themed continent areas: Americana, Europa, Africa, Scandinavia and the Orient. Today, with 170 acres of rides shows and attractions, Worlds of Fun is Kansas City's number one tourist attraction. Oceans of Fun opened in 1982 with wet and wild thrills for people of all ages. It is the Midwest's largest tropically themed water park with 60 acres of surf, sand and sun. For summer fun in Kansas City visit Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun -- The Place To Be For Fun!

ATTRACTIONS

From the opening of Worlds of Fun's first roller coaster, the Zambezi Zinger, to Cyclone Sam's in 1995, the park has given over 300 million rides. In 1995 alone, 11,796,206 rides were given. The most popular rides during the 1995 season include: Orient Express, 975,188; Zambezi Zinger, 942,830; Fury of the Nile, 849,570; Viking Voyager, 788,708 and Timber Wolf, 671,515. Oceans of Fun's Surf City Wave Pool holds a million gallons of water and its water slides combine for over 1,000 feet of splashing fun.



EMPLOYMENT

Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun, one of the area's largest employers, hires over 3,000 youth and adults each season. During its 23 years, the entertainment complex has employed close to 70,000 people, ranging in age from 15 to 81. There are 100 lifeguards at Oceans of Fun.



ENTERTAINMENT

The "Stax of Wax" Rock & Roll Revue production was the most popular show in 1995 with almost 800 performances and over 235,000 audience members. Other park entertainment includes: Fins and Flippers Dolphin Show, Incred-O-Dome, "Country Style" at the Tivoli Music Hall and the Rainforest Follies starring Julie and Ed Cardoza and their Happy Birds. Worlds of Fun also showcases national recording acts at the Forum Amphitheatre. Feature acts for 1996 include the Country Concert Series with Chely Wright, Bryan White and Steve Wariner, Martina McBride, Tracy Lawrence, Trisha Yearwood, Aaron Tippin and Diamond Rio with Wade Hayes; plus Christian acts Petra, Whiteheart, 4 Him and Kathy Troccoli.

FOOD

The Vittle Griddle was the most popular food stand at Worlds of Fun in 1995 and served over 40,000 hamburgers! Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun guests also ate close to 210,000 pounds of french fries. In addition, more than one million ice cream novelties were served in 1995.



MERCHANDISE



Worlds of Fun offers guests over 10,000 prizes and souvenirs in 52 games, shops, stands and carts throughout the park. The most popular souvenirs purchased in 1995 were glow necklaces, park maps, and pogs. Since Worlds of Fun opened, guests have won more than 11 million game prizes. College basketballs, plush lions and plush seals were favorite prizes in 1995. Guests took more than 100,000 shots at free throw long range basketball, the most popular game.

AWARDS AND HONORS

Worlds of Fun and Oceans of Fun make up the number one tourist attraction in Kansas City. Worlds of Fun's Timber Wolf wooden roller coaster was ranked among the top ten roller coasters in the world by the *Inside Track* 1995 readers poll. In 1995 Oceans of Fun lifeguards scored 100% on three unannounced safety audits. They also received the Gold Elite National Aquatic Safety Award for the sixth consecutive year, signifying their excellence in safety standards and performance. Worlds of Fun's in-house advertising department was recognized by the International Association of Amusement Parks and Attractions with a first place Brass Ring award for a radio commercial in the category of Amusement/Theme Parks with attendance 750,000 - 1.5 million. Another Worlds of Fun radio spot received a prestigious gold Omni award from the Advertising Club of Kansas City.
