Guests embark upon a day-long adventure by crossing the gangplank of the S. S. Henrietta, Jules Verne's renowned steamship from "Around the World in Eighty Days." Very soon you will travel to the . . .

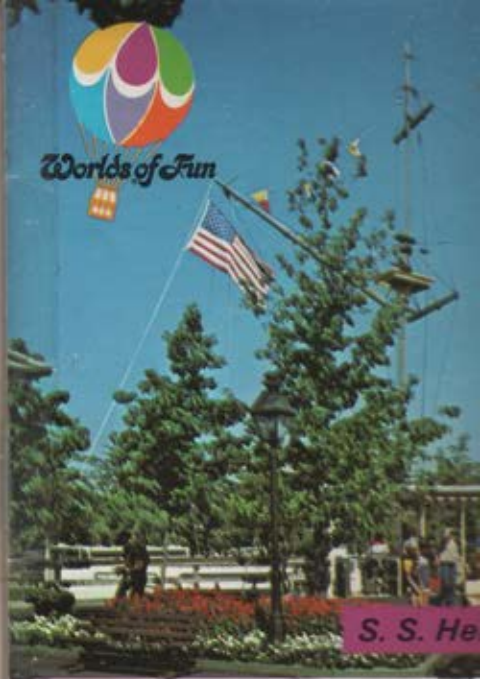
Cotton Blossom. It's the legendary stern-wheeler originally constructed in 1950 for the filming of the MGM movie classic, "Show Boat." The Cotton Blossom gift shop, a unique shopping experience; the Spittin' Image antique photography studio; and the Paddle Wheel Cafe sandwich shop are all found on board. Walk the gangplank, and you're on your way to the mysterious . . .

Orient. View the alluring gardens and tranquil waterways. Dizzying tentacles of the Oriental Octopus are here. So are eateries named Pagoda Soda and the Rangoon Refresher, and an exotic Far East market called Rickshaw Richard's Exporters. Fins and Flippers stars are mischievous, but oh so smart dolphins. Now, on your way to . . .

Scandinavia. Relax. Let the children make furry friends with "pettable" animals in the Alpine Animal Village, a miniature Scandinavian hamlet inhabited by a variety of animals from goats and geese to llamas and donkeys. Marvel at the skilled glass artist as he fashions his wares in one of the quaint shops of the Baltic Bazaar. Follow the applause to the Tivoli Music Hall, a 1,500 seat, indoor theater, for a lively musical production starring 20 talented young entertainers.

Are you game for one more fling? Then jump on the Finnish Fling, a ride that will spin you round and round. Shoot replica cannons at miniature frigates from the deck of the man-o-war schooner, Victrix. The schooner was built in 1948 and saw action in many movies, including "The Running of the Tide" and "Hawaii." It was later converted into a whaling ship for the 1953 filming of "All the Brothers Were Valiant." Crows nest, masts, rigging and full sails were utilized in the 1962 version of "Mutiny on the Bounty." Take a diving ski-slope ride down the Schuss-boomer and feel the refreshing spray as you splash through Norwegian fjords on the Viking Voyager flume ride. Stop by the gypsy wagon and see the puppet show featuring marionettes, body puppets, and hand puppets. Enjoy the speed and spin of the Scandia Scramble. Go under the train trestle, and you enter deep, dark . . .

Africa. Wander through rare jewels in the Diamond Mine; relax and refresh at the thatched roof Congo Clearing; but, beware of the mysterious jungle as you steer your jeep on the African Safari.

Expect shouts, screams, and breathless excitement as you scramble onto the giant Zambezi Zinger speed ride, one of the world's tallest and fastest rides. It plummets from the height of a seven-story building, twisting and turning through incredible dips before disappearing into a deep and dark tunnel. Catch your breath. Start preparing for your next journey into . . .

Europa. Traditional glamour and excitement of the continent awaits you. Hail an antique French taxi and enjoy a leisurely ride to the Moulin Rouge, a 300 seat indoor theater in the design of a European bistro. Stroll a peaceful, tree-lined promenade to the Forum, a 4,000 seat amphitheater where top recording stars periodically provide entertainment at no additional cost.

Stop by the brightly colored La Petite Toy Shop or have a snack at Le Poulet Bone sidewalk cafe. Step up the tempo with a fast, whirling ride in the Flying Dutchman and a twisting trip on Der Fender Bender along the bumper-crushing Autobahn. Your next stop is . . .

Americana. Bicentennial Square, an all-new themed area, has the atmosphere of a turn-of-the-century country fair. Dominating the area is the Screameroller — 1,200 feet of thrilling white knuckle twists, flips, and spins. Screameroller takes courageous passengers seven stories high, then speeds them downward at 56 feet per second through a complete upside-down loop — not once, but twice. After your ride, play skeeball in Uncle Sam's Skeeball Hall, the largest collection in the Midwest; try your skill at Calamity Games, eight booth-type skill games housed in a two-story structure and open-air pavilion; and enjoy the New Frontier, an up-dated version of the ever-popular penny arcade. Stroll by Bicentennial Bandstand and hear a variety of musical entertainment. Keep an eye out for those furry friends — those cuddly characters: Sam Panda, Grrrtrude Gorilla, and Dan'l Coon. They seem to be everywhere, making lasting friends with the youngsters.

Browse through old-time shops; walk the lively streets; grab some grub at the Vittle Griddle. Watch Worlds of Fun's panorama expand way, way below your seat on the Sky Hi aerial tram. Be sure to stop by the Union Depot and board the Eli, Worlds of Fun's steam locomotive. The Eli is a balloon-stacked 4-4-0 American-style engine — the traditional locomotive of American railroads over 100 years ago. Try to walk through the Great American Disaster; the tornado that brought it to Worlds of Fun still lives inside. The gunfighters are a fun-loving, less than serious bunch of characters that depict the way the West never was but should have been.

Throughout Worlds of Fun, you will find various on-grounds entertainment, refreshment carts, and talented portrait artists, there to capture your day's enjoyment on paper.

You will also find hundreds of friendly Ambassadors waiting to serve you in any way possible to help you enjoy your day at Worlds of Fun.

These cheerful Ambassadors, our many rides, shows, and attractions, and our striving for excellence are the reasons why Worlds of Fun remains one of the finest theme parks in the Midwest.
