
Scandinavia. Relax. Let the children play in our playground known as Humpty's Haven. Ride on the Schussboomer or, for those not so adventurous, walk and shop the Baltic Bazaar. Follow the applause to the Tivoli Music Hall, a 1,500 seat, indoor theater, for a lively musical production starring multi-talented young entertainers.

Are you game for one more fling? Then jump on the Finnish Fling, a ride that will spin you round and round. Shoot replica cannons at miniature frigates from the deck of the man-o-war schooner, Victrix. The schooner was built in 1948 and saw action in many movies including "The Running of the Tide" and "Hawaii." It was later converted into a whaling ship for the 1953 filming of "All the Brothers Were Valiant." Crows nest, masts, rigging and full sails were utilized in the 1962 version of "Mutiny on the Bounty." Feel the refreshing spray as you splash through Norwegian fjords on the Viking Voyager flume ride. Stop by the gypsy wagon and see the current show playing to all ages.
